4. Access to Drugs for Treatment of Noncommunicable Diseases

<u>Thomas Bollyky</u> explains the emerging controversy over patented medicines for noncommunicable diseases and their affordability in developing countries. Another transformation in global health is required that focuses on low-cost interventions and patient-centered rather than country-focused strategies.
